


Location: River's Edge Recreation Complex, 135 Davison Ave Woonsocket, RI

## CIVIL WAR MONUMENT

DEDICATED ON MAY 25, 1877

"IN GRATEFUL REMEMBRANCE OF HER BRAVE SONS, WHO DURING THE GREAT REBELLION, GAVE THEIR LIVES THAT THE UNION MIGHT LIVE.

THIS MONUMENT BEAR THE NAMES OF THE BRAVE MEN WHO FOUGHT AND DIED IN THE CIVIL WAR, AND THE NAMES OF THE MAJOR BATTLES.

LOCATED AT MONUMENT SQUARE, AT THE INTERSECTION OF KOPAL AND NORTH MAIN STREETS.

## GENERAL CASIMIR PULASKI MEMORIAL

DEDICATED ON A MONDAY, 1797

THIS MEMORIAL WAS Erected IN HONOR OF GENERAL PULASKI, WHO WAS AN AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR HERO.

GENERAL CASIMIR PULASKI, FATHER OF AMERICAN CAVALRY, POLISH ADRIALTY WHO FIGHTED FOR AMERICAN INDEPENDENCE, AND WAS MORTALLY WOUNDED AT THE BATTLE OF RED BANK, THE 1777.

LOCATED ON HARRIS AVENUE NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF HOMESTEAD ROAD.





## CIVIL WAR MONUMENT

DEDICATED ON MEMORIAL DAY 2015

THIS MONUMENT HONORS VETERANS WHO SERVED IN THE CIVIL WAR AND IS INSCRIBED WITH QUOTATIONS FROM WOONSOCKET RESIDENTS WHO SERVED IN THE WAR.

LOCATED IN THE OAK HILL CEMETERY 234 RATHBUN STREET

## ALICE MILL VETERANS OF WORLD WAR I MONUMENT

ERECTED BY THE WOONSOCKET RUBBER COMPANY TO REMEMBER ITS EMPLOYEES WHO FOUGHT IN WORLD WAR I. THIS MONUMENT LISTS NAMES OF THOSE FROM ALICE MILL WHO SERVED.

IN HONOR OF THE EMPLOYEES OF WOONSOCKET RUBBER COMPANY ALICE MILL WHO AT THE CALL OF THEIR COUNTRY LAID ASIDE THEIR VOCATIONS AND ENTERED THE SERVICE TO FIGHT IN THE GREAT WAR FOR WORLD WIDE LIBERTY (1917 - 1919)

ORIGINALLY LOCATED ON FAIRMOUNT STREET IN FRONT OF THE ALICE MILL IT WAS RELOCATED TO THE OAK HILL CEMETERY ON RATHBUN STREET.
